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

Dependencies



Dependencies (2)

- Who are the actors?
 - Users/producers
 - Platform
 - Editors
 - Government?

- What is their status?
 - Amateurs v. Professionals
 - Commercial v. Non-commercial

Dependencies (3)

- Where is the activity taking place?
 - Lack of harmonisation
 - Applicable law and jurisdiction



Some issues

- Intellectual property rights
- Privacy
- Liability
 - Users/producers
 - Intermediaries
- Contracts
- Defamation/racism/hate speech
- Journalists
- Audiovisual media services

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IPR – copyright

- What is protected?
 - Original material
 - Maps, datasets, photographs, descriptions ...
 - Different interpretations
- Who is protected?
 - The author/natural person
 - Collaborative works

IPR - copyright

- What rights?
 - Reproduction & making available (online)
 - Adaptation mash-ups?
 - Integrity
 - Attribution (right of paternity)
- Exceptions and limitations
 - Traditional exceptions
 - Derivative works
 - Fair use
- Licensing

Privacy – data protection

- Concept of personal data
 - Any information related to an identified or identifiable person
 - Very broad and vague
- "Citizens as sensors"
 - Location and tracking data
- Reasonable expectation of privacy?

Privacy – data protection

- Who is the data controller?
 - The user v. the platform
 - Obligations
 - Inform user
 - Notification
 - Keeping up to date
 - Technical measures
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- Personal data of minors

Liability (for incorrect content)

- Who is liable?
 - User
 - Identity and/or location?
 - Platform/editor
 - How far does his responsibility go?
 - What if it is a public body?

- Contract v. tort liability
 - Importance of warranty disclaimers and liability exonerations
 - Legal limitations

Liability (for illegal content)

- Liability of intermediaries
 - Limitation of liability for hosting services
 - For infringements on IPR, privacy, defamation, etc.
 - EU: e-commerce directive
 - US: Digital Millennium Copyright Act
 - Conditions
 - Only hosting
 - No actual knowledge of illegal activities
 - Upon knowledge, removal of infringing information
 - No duty to monitor
- The paradox of editorial activities...
